Horses Available for Sponsorship



JUNIOR—For some time now, we have wanted to give the opportunity to sponsor one of the horses in the wild. And we couldn't think of a better entry in starting this program than with the son of one of the most significant stallions of the herd who recently passed.

Amadeo Junior stands out much like his father did. He is a flashy sorrel stallion with a white blaze and a commanding stature. He inherited both of these traits from his dad.



RAYMOND—Raymond was born on the beach more than 20 years ago, the offspring of a wild Banker mare and a domestic donkey owned by a local farmer. We've analyzed Raymond's DNA and believe it or not he has just as much Spanish blood as many of the horses! Raymond will require specialized care for the rest of his life, including a special diet and regular vet visits.



LUNA—Born on Dews Island, Luna is about 15 years old and came to the CWHF rescue farm with her mother Brownie and six of her sisters in the fall of 2017. Luna's father was the well-known Little Red Man. Luna is becoming a wonderful ambassador for her breed and has shown the gentle nature and willingness to learn that was exhibited by her mother.

DUCKY— Ducky is a 9-year-old stallion who came to live at the rescue farm in May 2018 with his harem of 4 mares and his yearling son. Since Jan 2018, he and his harem continued to make their way around the northern fence in to False Cape and back Bay until we were forced to have them removed. While no longer wild, they are now safe and in the Fund's care. Ducky is particularly sweet and personable.



RITA— Rita is a 12-year-old mare who was rescued from the beach as a foal due to contracted tendons. She was adopted by a wonderful family who she lived with for many years. Rita's adopted mom became terminally ill in the spring of 2018 and she was returned to us with the promise of good care and love. We are happy to provide Rita with a forever home.
