



**Become a Sponsor:** Sponsor a critically endangered Banker horse of Corolla! In cases when a wild horse is observed to have a life-threatening illness or injury, intervention from the Corolla Wild Horse Fund is necessary. Rescued horses are brought to our farm on the mainland for treatment and sanctuary. There are **two** sponsor levels. **Horse Sponsorship Digital:** receives personalized certificate, horse photo, horse biography, periodic horse updates, quarterly newsletter via email. **Horse Sponsorship Plus:** receives embossed presentation folder with personalized certificate, horse photo, horse biography, member decal by mail, and periodic updates and quarterly newsletter via email. Sponsorships are symbolic, and donations help support all horses at the farm. Sponsorships can be renewed annually.

## Horses Available for Sponsorship



**Brio**

Brio is a 2-year-old colt, rescued in March 2022 when he was discovered alone, which we now know is because his mother had died. While technically old enough to survive without nursing, Brio was observed underweight and growing lethargic. At our farm, he was treated for pneumonia and poor nutrition. Now fully recovered, he is a happy colt who loves kids, playing with toys, and learning from his pasture-mates.

Junior is a 20-year-old stallion, rescued in July 2021 from choking. He is son of the late, well-known stallion Amadeo. At the farm, he is one of the most thoughtful stallions we've worked with, and often reminds us of his beloved father in both his striking appearance and kind personality.

Blossom is a 31-year-old mare, rescued in 2023 due to a severely torn ligament in her front leg. Unable to put weight on her leg, we felt it was best for her in her old age to come to the farm to allow the ligament to heal and fuse itself. She happily shares a pasture with Raymond the mule.

Rita is a 14-year-old mare taken off the beach after she was born with severely crooked hind legs. Once treated, she was adopted by a loving family. Her owner became terminally ill in 2018 and Rita returned to us for permanent sanctuary. She is our go-to-girl for educational programs.
